1. Medical Evidence Veterans Should Collect

- · Neurology & primary care notes
- ER/urgent care visit records
- · C&P; exam copies
- Prescription history (dates, refills, dosage changes)
- Test results (MRI, CT scans if applicable)

2. How to Get Your Records

VA Records – Request through MyHealtheVet, VA.gov "Blue Button" download, or file VA Form 10-5345 (Release of Information).

Private Medical Records – Request from your provider's medical records office; use HIPAA release forms. **C&P; Exam Reports** – Request directly from the VA or download from VA.gov under Disability → Documents.

3. Prescription Tracking Log

List your **migraine-related medications** here. If other prescribed medications cause side effects or trigger migraines, include them too.
